

[The National Register of Historic Places](#) is the Nation's official list of cultural resources worthy of preservation. Authorized under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, the National Register is part of a national program to coordinate and support public and private efforts to identify, evaluate, and protect our historic and archeological resources. Properties listed in the Register include districts, sites, buildings, structures, and objects that are significant in American history, architecture, archeology, engineering, and culture. The National Register is administered by the National Park Service, which is part of the U.S. Department of the Interior.

Various buildings, sites, etc. in Carroll County have received National Register status, and numerous others are eligible. Following is a list of National Register sites in Carroll County. More information can be found at the [National Register](#) website.

SE corner of Sec. 21, most of Sec. 22 and Areas N of Deer Creek, Delphi

Architectural Style: Greek Revival, Gothic Revival

Delphi Courthouse Square Historic District (2010 - District - #10000120) Includes the blocks immediately surrounding the public square and extends east to include the City Building and Delphi Public Library. Forty-three buildings are included within the boundaries, many dating from the 1850s-1870s. Within the [district](#) are three buildings previously listed individually on the National Register.

Also known as VanScoy 4/12C294 Irish canal-workers' construction camp of 1838-39 on the towpath trail along the Wabash and Erie Canal. At Sunset Point where the Deer Creek meets the Wabash.at Delphi.

Adams Mill Covered Bridge (1996 - Structure - #95001537)

Carrollton Bridge (2003 - Structure - #03000539)

Wabash and Erie Canal Culvert #100 (2002 - Structure - #02000194)

Also known as Burnett's Creek Arch—the oldest continually used bridge in Indiana, made of cut stone.

Wilson Bridge (2001 - Structure - #01000623)

Also known as Old Royster Road 1897 iron Pratt through-truss structure
