Deer Creek Park is one of two parks owned by Carroll County. It is a 12.7-acre site located at 600 Deer Creek Park

Its amenities include camping sites with electrical hook-ups, water, a large fishing pond, and picnic tables.

The clubhouse is a heated and cooled block facility with electricity, tables and chairs, and a refrigerator.

Usage and Fees



Use of the pond for fishing—day or night—recreational facilities, and picnic pavilions are free of charge.

- Each Tent Camping per Day \$10
- Each Camper per Day \$30
- Each Camper per Week \$150
- Each Clubhouse per Day \$45 plus a deposit of \$40

Fees include use of modern restrooms and showers as well as water and electrical hook-ups. Camping

Park Rules

- All paying customers receive park rules and receipts.

- One picnic table per camp may be used when available.
- All visitors are responsible for their own pets which must be on a leash. Nuisance pets will be removed.
- No pets are allowed in the basketball area.
- No alcohol is permitted in Deer Creek Park.
- All Park patrons must stay within park boundaries and not stray onto adjacent private property.
- Guns may not be discharged in the Park
- Boats may be unloaded only at your own risk
- No swimming is allowed
- Free firewood when available (Please do not abuse)
